Now it's time to talk about my favorite part of magic, card tricks. Have you ever did a card trick and you have no idea how it worked, it just works. Well most likely you are using one of the principals of card magic. Principals such as the freeland principle, the gilbreath principle by Norman Gilbreath, or the principle of 9 by Jim Steinmyer just to name a

few. All of these principles use highly complicated and very long mathematical equations. so nobody questions them, they just work. Why even the great Dai Vernon created the trick that he merely named, "the trick that can't be explained". But these principles have their pros and cons. Yes they are most of the time self working and certainly will fool the layman, but they can be

very long and sometime boring tricks that involve counting, adding and subtracting, spelling, or lots of dealing. This is sometimes a turn off for the spectator. It can also involve lots of memory work by the magician. In my case, that's bad. So you need to decide whether or not these kinds of tricks are for you. So how about it, want to see a card trick! .
